2 Enemies of Love Familiarity and Partiality

Familiarity in context to presumption

Example:

The Rejection at Nazareth. 54 [a]He came to his native place and taught the people in their synagogue. They were astonished [b] and said, "Where did this man get such wisdom and mighty deeds? 55 Is he not the carpenter's son? Is not his mother named Mary and his brothers James, Joseph, Simon, and Judas? 56 Are not his sisters all with us? Where did this man get all this?"
noun, plural fa·mil·i·ar·i·ties.

1. thorough knowledge or mastery of a thing, subject, etc. The state of being familiar; friendly relationship; close acquaintance; intimacy. 2. an absence of ceremony and formality; informality. 3. freedom of behavior justified only by the closest relationship; undue intimacy. Often familiarities. an instance of such freedom, as in action or speech.

Wrongly used: Sarcasm

banter, bitterness, contempt, cynicism, derision, irony, mockery
noun belief, hypothesis

assumption, likelihood, premise, supposition, suspicion, anticipation, basis, \
chance, conjecture, guess, opinion

Proverbs 28:21-22 King James Version (KJV)
